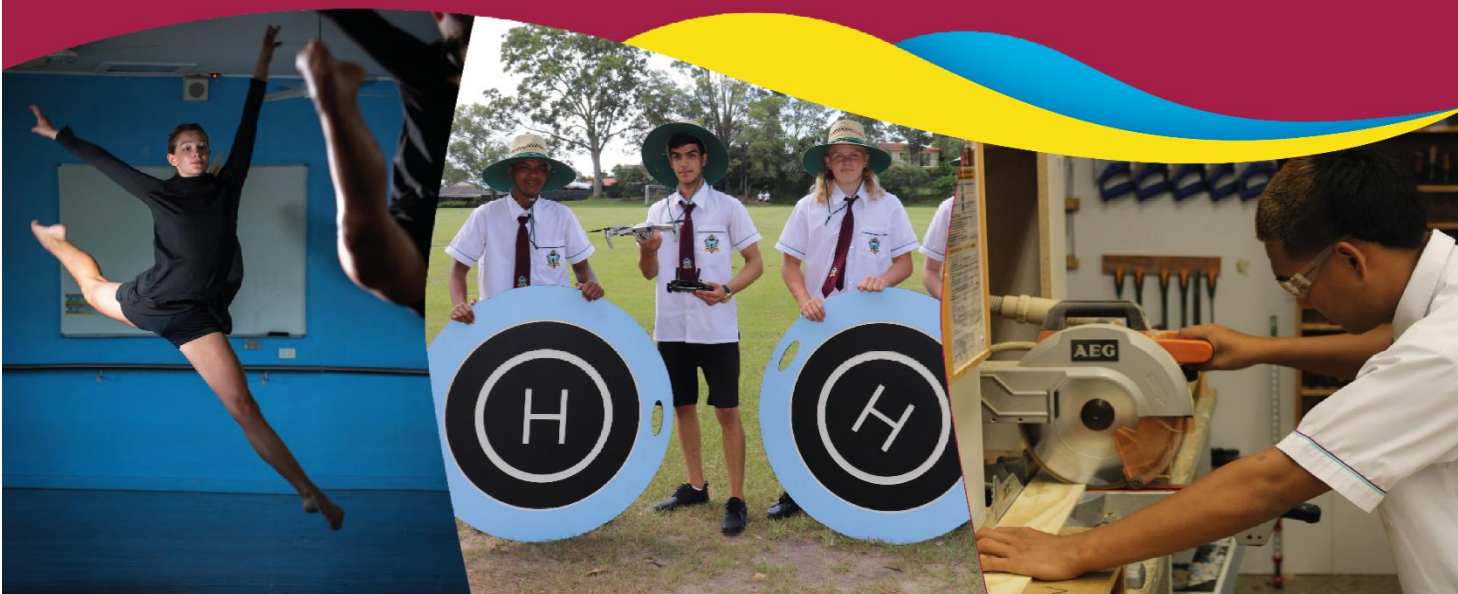

VETiS Funding Information

VET in Schools (VETiS)

Students who wish to undertake a VETiS course need to be fully aware that they can only undertake one VETiS course that is funded under the VETiS stream list. The qualifications that have been listed by industry as leading to employment are only of a Certificate I or II level in specific key skill shortage areas

The benefits gained by the student in studying a VETiS course are:

- Gaining an industry standard qualification recognised throughout Australia
- Receiving credits towards the QCE (QLD Certificate of Education)
- Beginning on a pathway to employment in their chosen industry

In VETiS courses, the external provider issues the qualification certificate. Therefore, you must complete a valid enrolment with that provider before commencing the course. This includes providing a USI (Unique Student Identifier). Completing the school subject selection form does not automatically ensure that the student is enrolled in a course with an external provider.

Traineeships

School-based Apprenticeships and Traineeships

School-based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SATs) allow high school students to work for an employer, train towards a recognised qualification, and complete their secondary school studies. They are available across a wide range of fields, from automotive to business; hospitality to watchmaking. SATs provide students with:

- Qualifications or skills that are recognised Australia-wide, and that can count towards the Queensland Certificate of Education
- Hands-on experience in a workplace
- Paid work
- The chance to also work towards an ATAR score
- Confidence and contacts to move from school to work or further study

Students completing a SAT may go to work one day per week, must be paid the award rate, and attend TAFE or meet with a trainer for the theory component of their traineeship/apprenticeship (eg. monthly, fortnightly, week block basis). They must attend school for the remaining four days.

Completion of a SAT gives valuable credits towards the student's Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE). The number of credits acquired will depend upon the type and level of certificate completed, but is always at least four credits.

As well as obtaining a Certificate level qualification, School-based Traineeships can also increase a student's rank and help with ATAR.

SAT Vacancies

Specialisations

The majority the traineeships that are usually available are in the fields of Business, Hospitality or Childcare. Most students complete a Certificate III in Business, while working in the Hospitality industry such as a café or fast food restaurant. For students interested in Childcare, there is a specific program in a local childcare centre.

Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care

Child Care Workers/Assistants provide for the individual needs of children and babies in their care under the guidance of a supervisor.

On completion of this traineeship the worker will be eligible to be employed in the following role:

- Assistant in long day care or occasional care centre
- Carer in a school-age care service
- Carer in a family day care scheme

Certificate III in Business (with Hospitality units)

This qualification provides a pathway to work in organisations such as restaurants, hotels, motels, clubs, pubs, cafés, and coffee shops. This qualification allows for multiskilling and for specialisation in accommodation services, food and beverage and gaming.

Certificate III Business Administration

The Certificate III in Business Administration is designed to develop a broad range of administrative competencies to be applied in varied work contexts. The skills and knowledge gained will allow an individual to work autonomously, under instruction or as a support to a team.

On completion of this traineeship the worker will be eligible to be employed in the following role: 'Office Administrator, Receptionist, Personal Assistant.'

Apprenticeships:

If you'd like an apprenticeship in the trade industry, the students must take it upon themselves to approach employers in the specific trade they're interested in. We recommend approaching family friends and relatives and even members of your sporting club. Once you have a lead / contact person, the school will liaise with them in arranging the steps & process of becoming a school based apprentice.

How to Apply

- Complete application form
- Prepare a resume as a digital copy
- Submit to Industry Liaison Officer
- Be prepared for an interview with an agency or employer
