- Case management meetings serve as a support mechanism for staff to identify next steps in student learning.

OUR STUDENTS ARE SOCIALLY AND EMOTIONALLY ENGAGED IN THEIR SCHOOLING


- Targeted parental engagement activities one per term, per year level.

- Positive Education is enacted through four areas Relationships, Diversity, Safety and Mindsets.


