- Address school assemblies/school events to promote the values and expectations of Keebra Park.
- Promote participation in activities such as house system events and whole school celebrations.
- Maintain correct uniform standards at all times and promote uniform expectations with peers.
- Maintain the school's high expectations attendance, behaviour, effort at all times.

School Vice-Captain (Yr 12)/Junior Vice-Captain (Yr 9)

- > Provide student voice on school policy/procedures and decision making for school improvement.
- > Liaise with staff and ELT (Principal, BM and Deputy Principals) to lead the school community.
- > Attend meetings with the Executive Leadership Team/Student Leadership team when required.
- Represent the student body at school functions and events, such as Anzac Parade and Awards Night.
- Assist School Captain to address school assemblies to promote the values of Keebra Park SHS.
- Promote participation in activities such as house system events and whole school celebrations.
- Maintain uniform standards at all times and promote expectations with peers.
- Maintain the school's high expectations attendance, behaviour, effort at all times.

Senior House Captains (Yr 12)/Junior House Captains (Yr 9)

- ➤ Lead your house by demonstrating skills in teamwork and participation in house events.
- Assist staff house leaders run events and encourage student involvement in all house events.
- Assist with organisation of house competitions to foster house spirit across the school.
- Support the organised lunchtime activities with other house and year level leaders.
- > Attend student leadership forums and assist school captains/vice-captains when required.
- > Be an outstanding role model to all students within the school at all times.
- Maintain uniform standards at all times and promote expectations with peers.

Year Level Leaders (Year 7, 8, 10, 11)

- Lead your year level by demonstrating skills in teamwork and participation in school events.
- Assist staff run events and encourage student involvement, including house events.
- > Attend student leadership meetings and assist school captains/vice-captains when required.
- > Be an outstanding role model to all students within the school at all times.
- Maintain uniform standards at all times and promote expectations with peers

Indigenous Leaders (Year 7-12 representatives)

- Work alongside peers to build a culture that celebrates and showcases our school's diversity.
- Promote strong communication and mentorship for all Indigenous students within the school.
- Assist with planning of school cultural events including: NAIDOC Week and Harmony Day.
- > Be an outstanding role model to all students within the school at all times.
- Work with The Chungarra Dance Group to promote connection to culture.
- Maintain uniform standards at all times.

Eligibility Criteria -School Captain, Vice-Captain, and House Captain - Junior (Yr 9) and Senior (Yr 12) Applicants must meet the following standards:

- Commendable attendance greater than 85% for year
- > Creditable effort/behaviour "excellent" and "very good" in subjects on semester report cards.
- Consistently complies with school uniform policy and Student Code of Conduct
- > Representation at school and public events, such as ANZAC parade & sports carnivals.

Method of Selection:

- 1. <u>Complete</u> application. Parent/caregiver must endorse your application. Selection criteria questions must be answered and sent to email address provided.
- 2. <u>Submit completed application via email: studentleadership@keebraparkshs.eq.edu.au</u>
- 3. Shortlisting: applications are considered. Nominees notified to prepare a speech (if required).
- 4. <u>Present</u> a speech(maximum 1-2 minute) to your peers at a junior or senior parade.
- 5. <u>Voting</u>: staff and student voting occurs via Survey Monkey.
- 6. <u>Participate</u> in an interview process with members of the KPSHS Leadership Team (if required).
